I would like to ask for some information via a FOI on Personal Health Budgets data published in Q3 via [Personal Health Budget \(PHB\) - NHS England Digital website](#).

The figures for your ICB (NHS STAFFORDSHIRE AND STOKE-ON-TRENT INTEGRATED CARE BOARD) published show that you have 9 Childrens Continuing Care (CCC) Direct Payment PHBs.

Could you help me understand the following information for these 9 Childrens Continuing Care (CCC) Direct Payment PHBs.

- 1. *What percentage (%) does NHS STAFFORDSHIRE AND STOKE-ON-TRENT INTEGRATED CARE BOARD use the following methods to promote / support these 9 CCC Direct Payment PHBs?***
 - a. 3rd Party support companies (e.g. Enham Trust, Penderels, Solo Support, etc).**
