The Serious Case Initial Findings (SCIF) Standards Operating Procedure supports the implementation of the Serious Incident, Incident and Complaints Policies across the Urgent Care Division.

The scope of the SOP is to establish, once review of the initial findings has been completed, whether or not, the incident constitutes a serious incident and whether this needs to be notified to outside organisations for example the HSE.

RIDDOR notifications are only made by the Head of Health and Safety or Head of Clinical Governance.
